Dear Mr. Marootion:

We are writing on behalf of a large community of watersport enthusiasts, powerboat owners, environmentalists and other river users to express our concerns that the D.C. Department of Transportation is actively pursuing development projects alongside and in our local waterways without sufficient consultation with the user groups most familiar with how the river is currently used for navigation, recreation, competition and environmental education. These development projects include, but are not limited to, the Frederick Douglass Memorial Bridge Replacement Project, the Anacostia Riverwalk Trail Pedestrian Bridge to the National Arboretum, the RFK Campus Redevelopment Campaign and the Potomac Commuter Fast Ferry.

We believe it is important that our community of river users be treated as vital stakeholders and consulted in the planning and execution of any transportation project that will have a short or long-term impact on safe marine operations, such as changes in water traffic patterns, waterway closures, and new obstacles in the river.

As operators of marine vessels of varying size, maneuverability and power, we have unique perspectives and we are intimately familiar with the character and navigation of our waterways. We have developed thriving boathouses and marinas along the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers, and we offer programming such as boating, fishing and environmental education for thousands of area residents and visitors. We draw people to the rivers to learn, recreate and compete, and along the way we challenge the perceptions that the District's rivers are dirty, dangerous, and neglected. The city has received a substantial economic benefit from our programming.

Any construction activities in our waterways could have a potentially significant impact on the safe use of the river for our members, particularly without coordination and communication. Permanent fixtures in the river may demonstrably and significantly affect navigation and could result in increased silting and shoaling.

We strongly support projects that make waterways more accessible and promote healthy rivers, and we acknowledge the need for critical improvements to the city's transportation infrastructure. But, it is critical that DDOT consult with our community so that the agency can make informed decisions that account for diverse uses of our waterways and the safety, environmental, and recreational impacts of development, growth and increased traffic. While we understand the DDOT and the National Park Service did meet recently with the Port Towns Community Boathouse to receive their concerns regarding the development of the Arboretum Bridge and Trail, the undersigned organizations ask to be recognized as stakeholders on all projects – current or future - that will impact river navigation.
